Many of the serious health concerns in modern America can be linked to poor diet. People who regularly consume foods high in sodium, sugar, and saturated fats not only increase their chances of obesity, but also increase their risks of developing heart disease, hypertension, diabetes, and several types of cancer.

Although some people who regularly consume unhealthy foods do it consciously, there is also a significant portion of the population that remains undereducated about proper nutrition.

Another reason why people are high consumers of unhealthy foods is the high cost that they have. Fresh meats, dairy products, fruit and vegetables are sometimes unavailable at local convenience stores or

small markets. They usually get packaged, processed foods that offer little nutritional value. One way that the government can help to offset this issue is by offering tax breaks or other incentives for supermarkets in low-income areas. Community gardens, independent food stores, and farmers' markets are all examples of local initiatives that can substitute for or supplement the opening of a major chain supermarket. Despite the time, dedication, and funds required for community members to initiate such programs, these efforts can be incredibly beneficial, not only in providing people with access to healthier foods, but also in instilling a sense of community in the residents of these neighborhoods.
